Ephesians 6:10

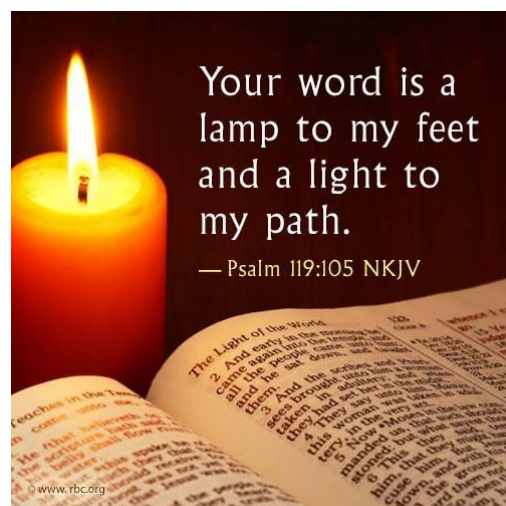
